Point 3: The Technical SEO Health Check

Can Google properly crawl and understand your site?

- XML Sitemap:** Exists and submitted to Google Search Console
- Robots.txt:** Properly configured and not blocking important resources
- Clean URL Structure:** URLs are human-readable and logical

Mobile Responsiveness: Site renders perfectly on all devices

Structured Data Errors: Zero critical errors in Google Search Console

Part 3: The Schema Starting Point Assessment
